Usual Conditions for a Plenary Indulgence

To gain the indulgence the usual following conditions must be met.

- 1. Sacramental confession and Communion within a brief time (about 20 days)
- **2.** The prescribed good work (for 31 Dec. the public recital of the *Te Deum;* 1 Jan. *Veni Creator Spiritus*)
- **3.** Prayers for the Pope's designated intentions (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary)
- **4.** Detestation of and detachment from even venial sins (without which only a partial indulgence can be gained), at the time of the indulgenced work.
