O LORD Jesus Christ, Son of the living God,
receive this my bounden service and ministry
with that transcending love wherewith Thou didst absolve
the Blessed Mary Magdalene, and all sinners
who fled for refuge unto Thee.

And whereinsoever I have failed
in the administration of this holy sacrament
through my negligence or imperfection,
do Thou deign to satisfy for me and supply all my defects.

I commend to Thy sweetest Heart
all and each of those who have now confessed
their sins to me,
beseeching Thee to keep them evermore,
to preserve them from falling back again to sin,
and after this miserable life to bring them
to Thine everlasting joy. Amen.



PRIEST'S PRAYER BEFORE HEARING CONFESSIONS

Grant to me, O Lord, Wisdom, the attendant at Your throne,
that I may know how to judge Your people in justice,
and Your poor ones with equity.

Let me so use the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven
that I may open to no one upon whom they should shut,
nor close them to any for whom they should open.

May my intention be pure, my zeal sincere,
my charity patient, my labor fruitful.

Let me be gentle without weakness,
severe without harshness.

Let me not disdain the poor;
nor fawn upon the rich.

Make me kind that I may attract sinners,
prudent in questioning them,
skillful in directing them.

Grant to me, I pray, skill to lead them back from evil,
zeal in confirming them in good,
diligence in elevating them to better things.

Grant me maturity in answering questions,
correctness in counseling,

light when things are obscure,
wisdom when they are entangled,
victory when they are difficult.

Let me not be detained by useless conversation,
or corrupted by perverse things;
let me save others, and not be lost myself. Amen.

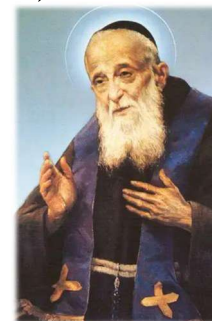

The Order for Reconciling Individual Penitents

THE RECEPTION OF THE PENITENT

41. When the penitent comes to confess his (her) sins, the Priest welcomes him (her) with kindness and greets him (her) with friendly words.

42. Then the penitent and, if appropriate, the Priest as well, sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross, saying:

In the name of the Father, and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



The Priest invites the penitent to have trust in God, in these or similar words:

May God, who has shone His light
in our hearts
grant that you may truly know
your sins
and His Mercy.

The penitent replies: Amen.

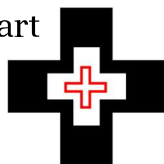
THE CONFESSION OF SINS AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF SATISFACTION

44. Next, the penitent confesses his (her) sins...

THE PRAYER OF THE PENITENT AND THE ABSOLUTION

45. The priest then invites the penitent to express his (her) contrition, which the penitent may do in these or similar words:

O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart
for all the wrong I have done
and for the good I have failed to do,
because by sinning I have offended You,
who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things.
I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace,
to do penance, to sin no more,
and to avoid the occasions of sin.
Through the merits of the Passion
of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.



Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

46. Then the Priest, extending his hands over the penitent's head (or at least extending his right hand), says:

God, the Father of mercies,
through the Death and Resurrection of His Son
has reconciled the world to Himself
and poured out the Holy Spirit
for the forgiveness of sins;
through the ministry of the Church
may God grant you pardon and peace.

**AND I ABSOLVE YOU FROM YOUR SINS
IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, +
AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.**

The penitent replies: Amen.

THE PROCLAMATION OF PRAISE OF GOD AND THE DISMISSAL OF THE PENITENT

47. After the absolution, the Priest continues:

Give thanks to the Lord for He is good.

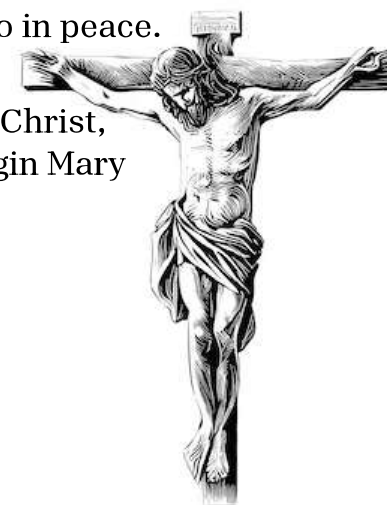
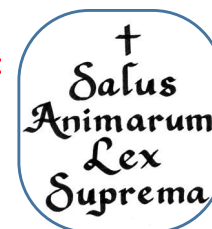
The penitent concludes:

For His mercy endures for ever.

Then the Priest dismisses the penitent who has been reconciled, saying:

The Lord has forgiven your sins. Go in peace.
or

May the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ,
the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary
and of all the Saints,
Whatever good you do
and whatever evil you endure,
be for you a remedy for sin,
an increase of grace,
and the reward of eternal life.
Go in peace.
